**FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION:** The story of the wise and foolish virgins, like other parables, is taken from the world of everyday experience. The story is quite simple. Since the wedding party is delayed until midnight, the young women fall asleep, only to be awakened by a loud cry that the procession is near. They wake up and relight their lamps. When the foolish ones who had brought no oil ask the others to share theirs, they are told that there may not be enough and sent on a shopping trip...at midnight! When they return, the feast has started and the door locked. What does the parable mean? The usual interpretation sees it as an allegory to urge watchfulness during Jesus' absence. The foolish bridesmaids warn us against a presumptuous reliance on others, while the wise women are models for us to follow. The wise in the Gospel are both strong and realistic. This week perhaps we could prayerfully check the oil supply in our own lamps and recall those people whose wisdom has been a lamp in our lives.

**NEW NATIONAL RESTRICTIONS** have now come into effect for a month until Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December. This means that St Catherine's is now closed for the celebration of Mass, Baptisms and Weddings. However, it is open for private prayer on Tuesdays at 9.15am until 10.15am. Funerals are exempt from the restrictions and are able to take place in church with a maximum number of 30 people. Fr David will celebrate Mass via Zoom on Thursdays at 9.15am and Sundays at 10am. Children's Liturgy via Zoom continues on Sundays at 11.15am. There is now one link to access both Masses: <https://us02web.zoom.us/j/84015861524> This link will take you straight to the Mass. The link is also available on our website. Those who are already on the Online Mass mailing list will continue to be sent the link each week together with the recording of Sunday Mass shortly after Mass has been celebrated. **GUIDANCE FOR PRIVATE PRAYER:** In line with governmental and diocesan guidelines we have the following safety measures in place:

- on arrival a steward will ask you to sanitise your hands and guide you to a suitable bench depending on whether you have come as part of a household or as an individual observing at all times a 2m social distancing procedure. A maximum of ten people are permitted in the church at any time during private prayer.
- everyone must wear face coverings; please bring your own covering with you. There will be some available if you do not have one.
- individual private prayer is for 15 minutes duration. Please support the stewards by keeping to the guidance. You may be politely reminded when your 15 minutes has elapsed.
- you can choose whether you would like to leave your name and contact details as part of the NHS Test and Trace service. You can either use the QR code on the posters which can be found at the entrance, or you will find a card and pen in your bench to do so. This information will be kept by the Parish for 21 days and destroyed after this time.
- Thank you very much for your co-operation and understanding.

The annual Mass of Remembrance will take place at the end of November.

**REFURBISHMENT:** The internal facing of the front wall up in the choir loft has been decaying for some years; it has recently been refurbished and painted by parishioners in a sympathetic colour scheme that lightens the upstairs area and highlights the lovely stained-glass windows. Pointing and external remedial roof work to the choir loft dormer windows may be necessary to prevent further degradation: drone inspection technology will be deployed in a possible first for a Wirral church. Upgrades have also been made to the emergency lighting and emergency exit signs in church, lounge, hall and school.

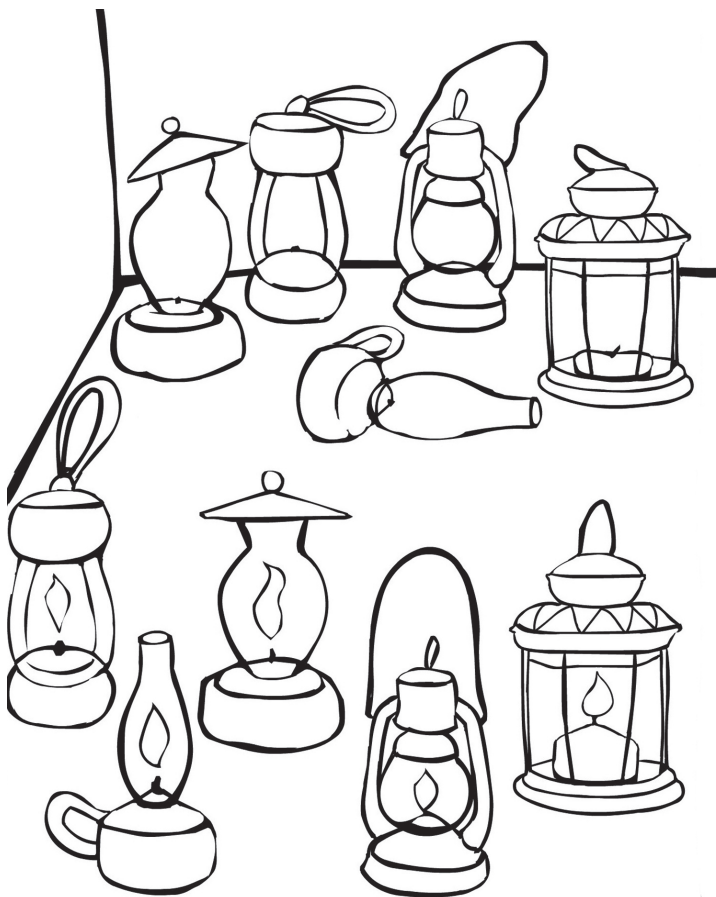
