FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: Today's passage from Luke 20 is a controversial story in which Jesus debates with some Sadducees about resurrection. On this matter Jesus stood with the Pharisees (strong proponents of resurrection). We may presume that the Sadducees already knew Jesus's view on this matter and wanted to trap him into admitting that belief in resurrection is unbiblical and illogical. Sadducees held that belief in resurrection was not biblical. To show its absurdity, they put forward an example in which seven brothers in turn marry the same woman. All die, and finally the woman dies. The Sadducees ask Jesus, whose wife will she be at the resurrection? Using the debating techniques of his time, Jesus argues that the Sadducees have failed to understand the nature of resurrection and the scriptures. While to us today the biblical argument used by Jesus may seem artificial, it was presumably understandable and even convincing to Jews in Jesus's time. Behind these arguments is Jesus's affirmation that the God of the Bible is the God of living, and that resurrection is based on the nature of God and is God's gift to us. In November we recall those who have died. In doing so there are surely feelings of sadness, loss and abandonment. Yet beyond these very real feelings there is the hope that we will see our loved ones again in the resurrection of the dead and are now in communion with them.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. THOMAS: Fr. David has asked me to provide a short update on my new ministry. I live with the Capuchins at Careggi (10 minutes from Florence) and our convent is part of the hospital. There are altogether 7 friars in this community, 3 Italians, 2 Africans and 2 Indians. We all work as hospital chaplains. It is a Medical College (Careggi University Hospital). It is a very big hospital and so there are many different faculties. I work at CTO - Orthopaedic Trauma Center. My duty is to visit the sick every day (praying, anointing, counselling, hearing confessions, etc). It is quite a challenging ministry as not all the sick wish to have the presence of a priest. I do an on-call duty twice a week, 24-48 hours. I miss you all at St. Catherine's.
